Remembering Bill "Doc" Hunter

William Paul "Bill" Hunter, 63, of Pratt died unexpectedly on Friday, July 15, 2016.

He was born Oct. 18, 1952, in Parsons to Paul W. and Helen R. Hunter. He graduated from Labette County Community High School in Altamont, and was a proud Wildcat, graduating from Kansas State University with a bachelor's of science degree in agriculture with a teaching certification. He also earned master's and doctoral degrees in agricultural education from the University of Missouri-Columbia.



Bill devoted his life to training the next generations of farmers who will feed the world. He was a high school agriculture instructor at Burlingame and Westmoreland and at Salisbury, Mo. He also was an ag economics curriculum specialist for the Vocational Agriculture Service at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He taught at Pratt Community College 23 years as an agriculture instructor, and formerly was department chair of agriculture and technology education at the college.

He was a leader in regional and national professional organizations, including serving as Region II vice president and chair of the Diversity Committee of the National Association of Agricultural Educators and as an NAAE consultant to the national FFA Board of Directors. He also was a past president of the Kansas FFA Association Executive Board. He received honorary state FFA degrees from the Kansas and Illinois FFA associations and an honorary American FFA degree.

He threw himself into any and all activities that would give his students hands-on experience or professional opportunities. He was the longtime adviser to the PCC Block & Bridle Club and took great pride in the success of his students in national Block & Bridle, ag business management and Quiz Bowl competitions.

PCC Student Pays Homage to Late Ag Instructor

A Pratt Community College Agriculture student is honoring the late Bill "Doc" Hunter with a shiny statement and homage to his life. Kelly Doherty, a sophomore returning to PCC this fall, has set out to show her appreciation for "Doc" in the form of a custom silver belt buckle.

A fitting tribute to the beloved Ag instructor but she needs help in making it a reality. After Doherty learned of "Doc's" passing Friday Jul 15 she was inspired to commemorate his memory by entering a drawing into a belt buckle contest. The contest boasts a free custom silver belt buckle from Molly's Custom Silver located in Riverside, Calif to the design submitted that gets the most "Likes" on Facebook.

Doherty entered the contest with a drawing she created the day "Doc" passed. The drawing features the shape of his notorious cowboy hat, a sunflower in between wheat, cattle hoof prints, and PCC's Beaver. It says "In Memory of "Doc" William Paul Hunter, WHAT'S UP DOC? October 18, 1952-July 15, 2016".




"To me, the buckle represents his life," said Doherty. "He lived life to the fullest and that legacy reminds me to do the same."

Doherty says that Doc had an impact on her during the short time that she knew him.

"Hearing all of his stories (even when they got long) told me there is much to be done in the short time we have," said Doherty. "I admired his dedication and that encourages me to do my best at what I'm passionate about."

PCC Partners with Skyland Grain for New Agriculture Program

Pratt Community College and Skyland Grain, LLC from Johnson, Kan are partnering together to add a new certificate program to the popular Agriculture and Ag Power departments. Students will be able to enroll in a Crop Application one year certificate program beginning this Fall. At the end of the program students will have learned fundamentals of agriculture science, technology and gain workforce experience from Skyland Grain.

Crop Applicator careers are on the rise according to PCC's Career Coach. Job openings are projected to grow six percent over the next 10 Years and starting salary ranges between \$44,000 and \$55,000 at Skyland Grain. Crop Applicators are highly trained professionals specializing in pesticide handlers, sprayers and applicators, mixing pesticides, herbicides, or insect sprays and repellents for application on lawns, landscapes, crop fields and pastures. They are able to identify areas requiring treatment and they manage the transportation of equipment and chemicals to and from the treatment site.

Skyland Grain and PCC are working together to make this program a success for students. Skyland Grain's CEO David Cron says PCC was a clear choice to partner with.

"I think one of the big reasons for choosing PCC was also their strong agriculture programs, commitment to agriculture and history with agriculture," said Cron. "We are positive this new program will provide students with an avenue for a high paying, productive career in agriculture as well as provide well trained potential employees for Skyland."

Pratt Community College's Skyland Grain Crop Applicator option is a one year, 34 credit hour, Certificate Program. To successfully complete the Program, students are required to enroll in an occupational work experience course and be prepared to test for the Commercial Pesticide Applicator License and obtain a Class A Commercial Driver's License upon employment.

"The Crop Applicator Program will provide students enrolled in the program excellent hands on experience," said Skyland Grain Agronomy Manager Justin Ochs. "The occupational workforce course will provide them with valuable experience, they will be exposed to situations over the course of a year that they could potentially see out in the field while on their new crop applicator job."

Skyland Grain Assistant CEO David Rodriquez says that the new program will provide students with a long term career avenue.

"The program will provide students with the opportunity to not just get a job, it puts them in the driver seat of a spray rig so they can have a valuable long term career," said Rodriguez.

"I am very excited that Jenny has agreed to be our next volleyball coach", Wilson added. "She is familiar with the Jayhawk conference as well as the NCAA level. These are significant experiences that will benefit our student-athletes at PCC."

Mueller looks to build on the strong volleyball tradition at PCC.

"I'm very excited to be named the head volleyball coach at Pratt Community College," said Mueller. "The tradition of solid competition within this program is strong, so I'm anxious to meet the team and start training for the upcoming season. The Jayhawk is a talented and competitive conference, and I'm looking forward to doing the work needed to drive to the top. I would like to thank Bill Wilson and Dr. Calvert for the opportunity to lead this team and be a part of the coaching staff at PCC."

Mueller comes to PCC after serving as the head volleyball coach at NCAA Division II Pittsburg State University in Pittsburg, Kansas. Prior to her stint as the head coach at Pitt State Mueller served as the assistant coach for the Gorillas for three seasons. During her tenure at PSU, the Gorillas had 18 All-MIAA players including the 2013 MIAA Freshmen of the Year.

Prior to her tenure at Pitt State, Mueller was the head coach at William Woods University from 2008-2010. She would mentor two NAIA All-Americans and 10 All-Conference players at WWU. She also has served as the head coach at Coffeyville Community College for three years, as well as serving on the staffs at Central Missouri University and Washburn University.

Mueller is a graduate of Central Missouri University where she also earned her master's degree.
